We welcome Brother Kenneth Kalinowski from the District of Eastern North America Brothers of the Christian Schools. Brother Kenneth Kalinowski, FSC and is a member of the DeLaSalle Brothers, who sponsor LaSalle Institute in Troy, LaSalle School for Boys, and CBA in Albany. Their Order is in over 80 countries and Brother Ken has served in Papua New Guinea as a Missionary. He has been in Haiti, Kenya, and in Mexico and he is currently the Principal of DeLaSalle Collegiate in Warren, Michigan. He will be with Father Rutherford on Saturday at Holy Trinity and Sunday at St. Michael's.

Papua New Guinea received independence 50 years ago and is in need of so much. The unemployment rate is nearly 80% and in most instances, one family member may have employment and income for the extended family. The average life span is nearly 42 and 45 for woman. It is called the land of 800 languages and is still very tribal. Education is a privilege and most want to learn so that they can find employment in tourism. The average income is about 5,000 US dollars per year, unfortunately, there is a high death rate for children, and western medicine is hard to come by. The Brothers sponsor a total of 5 schools in the country where the average class is over 40 students per classroom. The average family eats one meal per day, they sponsor a breakfast club which is a bowl of rice per morning.

The need is great; whatever you are able to do is most appreciated! God Bless!!

Please remember that a student must complete two years of Faith Formation (not including kindergarten) before making First Communion. This usually begins in First grade, but any grade level is welcome to prepare for First Communion. Three years of Faith Formation instruction are required for Confirmation, usually beginning in Eighth grade with Confirmation being made in the Spring of Tenth grade.
